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Introduction

The Aboriginal Fire Management Plan is the practical component of the Aboriginal Fire Management Framework. All work outlines in this Plan falls under the protocols and conditions stipulated in the Aboriginal Fire Management Framework.

The 2015-16 Aboriginal Fire Management Plan (AFMP) is the inaugural year that these working are to be completed. The aims and objectives stipulated in this plan have been devised in consultation with the local Ngunnawal community, PCS Fire Management Unit and PCS Community and Visitor Programme. The activities outlined in the 2015-16 AFMP have been accepted and approved by the Commissioner of the Emergency Services Agency (ESA) through approval of the BOP.





Strategic Objectives

The 2015-16 has three Strategic Objectives:

- Establish Standard Operating Procedures for all ACT Parks and Conservation staff in relation to cultural heritage protection on fire sites;
- 2. Organise a pool of resources to effectively implement the current *IFMP 2015-16* and ensuing IFMPs in *2016-17* and *2017-18* and;
- **3.** Re-initiate cultural burning practices in the ACT with Traditional Custodians.





Who is responsible?

The Aboriginal Fire Management Project Officer is responsible for successful completion of the Aboriginal Fire Management Plan. The project officer is required to work within and between teams in Parks and Conservation Services to achieve the objectives as outlined in this, 2015-16 AFMP.

The Aboriginal Fire Management Project Officer reports to the Partnerships Coordinator of the Community and Visitor Programme and the head of the Fire Management Unit.

The Aboriginal Fire Management Project Officer is also responsible for the preparation of an end of



cycle report on the activities outlined in this Plan. This report shall detail the completed works and provide justification of any non-completed works
